**Trash pick-up** is weekly on Fridays.

Four bags or cans per household.

The following items are not allowed in the trash:

Drums - metal or plastic, Wet Paint (DRIED OK), Chemicals, Batteries, Appliances with Freon, Hazardous materials

Cans can be set out after 6 on Thursdays, bagged trash to be placed on Friday mornings.

**Recycling** is on alternate Fridays, please place your recyclables in containers and have at the curb by 7:30.

Recycling boxes may be obtained from the Town Clerk, 532-8358 at 8469 Main Street.

All trash and recycling containers should be removed from curbside by Friday evening.

**Grass Clippings**

Do not leave grass clippings in the road way

Clean out your brush and tree materials and load them into the Village truck overnight or on a weekend.

**Community Memorial Garden**

Sponsored by the Interlaken Community Action Group, many of the flowers and shrubs are labeled for easy identification. Please stop often for a visit.

**Water Rates**

Inside Village \$40 minimum up to 5,000 gallons

\$6.50 per 1,000 gallons over 5000

Outside Village \$50 minimum up to 5,000 gallons \$8.00 per 1,000 gallons over minimum

**Sewer Rates**

Village \$25.00 minimum up to 5,000 gallons of water usage

\$4.00 per 1,000 gallons over 5000 gallons of water usage

**Sidewalk Repair Program**

Sidewalks are done on worst first basis

The Department of Public Works will tear out the old sidewalk

The DPW has forms to borrow

The DPW will supply stone for the base

The home owner hires the contractor with approval of DPW and Village Board

The Contractor forms the site, pours the concrete, takes off the forms and cleans up forms

The DPW will then put dirt and grass seed along edges and straw

All forms must be inspected by Department of Public Works before concrete is poured.

All sidewalks are four feet by 4" thick—with reinforcing wire, 6" thick at driveways

Concrete is fibered

Concrete is billed to the Village, 3500 pounds minimum

## Interlaken Olde Home Day 2010     June 12, 2010

The Interlaken Community Action Group began working on Olde Home Day 2010 within days of sweeping the parking lot after OHD2009. Meeting over the winter, plans have been made for all the favorites and a few new events this year as well.

Vendors, music, displays and food are all on the line up, as is the bouncy house for the littlest visitors. New events this year are a photography contest and a building search for youth.

South Seneca Chapter Order of the Eastern Star and Farmerville-Union Masonic Lodge are sponsoring a community wide photography contest. There are two categories **Our Beautiful Community** and **People Making a Difference**, and three age divisions 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade, 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> grade, and Adults. Community voting on Olde Home Day will determine the winners in each category and division. Photographs need to be taken since last year's Olde Home Day by residents (year round or occasional) of the area. Entries need to be delivered the week of June 1<sup>st</sup> to June 7<sup>th</sup> to Jay's Deli and Video so that they can be numbered and prepared for display.

Visitors on Olde Home Day will be given a ballot and asked to select their favorite in each division and category. At the end of the day, six winners will be announced, prizes given, and the photographs placed on display for the rest of the month. Also new this year is a building search for children. Visit the Interlaken Grange table at the library to receive a picture search card. On the card will be pictures of buildings along Main Street or people at Olde Home Day. At each loca-

tion the card will be stamped. Once all the squares are stamped return the card to the Grange table for a small thank you gift for participating.

Even as the new items are added, all the old favorites will still be available. There will be music all day and dancing in the evening. A variety of musical events are planned for the morning, the South Seneca School groups will perform after the parade, and Silverado closes the event in the evening.

Vendors are a main fixture of Olde Home Day and organizers report a great group for your shopping experience. Look for the Green Thumb Garden Club on the Library Lawn along with the Library Book Sale and many others.

Lots of great food will be available all day. Merchants and organizations will have everything from chicken bar-b-q to hot sausage and maybe even strawberry shortcake for you to enjoy.

The Interlaken Historical Society museums will be open, Car Pride will have their cars on display and in the parade, and a number of local organizations will have informational tables. The parade steps off at 1:00 p.m. from the school.
